Financial Assistance Information at Cornell College:

This would include, but is not limited to, federal, state and institutional assistance, how aid will be disbursed, the rights and responsibilities of students receiving financial assistance and criteria for measuring satisfactory academic progress.

Information about Cornell College:

Information pertaining to Cornell College can be found in the Cornell College Catalogue or on the Cornell College Web site. This would include, but is not limited to, the names of associations, agencies, and/or governmental bodies that accredit, approve, or license the school and its programs, and the procedures by which a student may receive a copy for review of the school's accreditation, licensure, or approval, costs of attending Cornell College, the degree programs, and the availability of a GED program.

FERPA Information at Cornell College:

Information pertaining to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) can be obtained from the Cornell College Registrar's Office, catalogue, or Web site.

Information about Cornell College's Campus Security Report:

The Cornell College campus security report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by Cornell College; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, sexual assault, and other matters. Cornell College's Completion or Graduation Rate:

Information pertaining to Cornell College's completion or graduation rates can be obtained from the Director of Institutional Research. This report would include, but is not limited to, completion or graduation rates and if applicable transfer-out rates for a specific cohort of the general student body. This would include certificate-or degree-seeking, full-time, first time undergraduate students, completion or graduation rates for students who transfer into Cornell College, and completion or graduation rate and transfer-out rate for the students described as "Exceptions" to the requirements; including students who –

- have left school to serve in the Armed Forces;
- have left school to serve on official church missions;
- have left school to serve with a foreign aid service of the Federal Government, such as the Peace Corps; or are totally or permanently disabled.

Athletic Programs at Cornell College:

The Cornell College annual athletic program report (EADA) includes, but is not limited to participation rates, financial support, recruiting expenses, institutional salaries for coaches, and athletically-related student aid, if any. This information can be obtained from the Director of Institutional Research.

Drug and Alcohol Prevention at Cornell College:

The Cornell College drug and alcohol prevention materials include, but are not limited to, standards of conduct that clearly prohibit, at a minimum, the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of drugs and alcohol by students and employees on the schools property, or as part of the schools activities, a description of any drug and alcohol counseling, treatment, or rehabilitation, and a description of the health risks associated with the use of illicit drugs and alcohol. Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA):
