Monopoly Athenaze, Chapter 6b Dative Case

1. **Monopoly**. In groups of three, one person asks a second for something, and a third describes what is happening. The object of the game is to acquire as many things as possible from the rest of the group so that you have a monopoly on, e.g., water bottles.

Example:	After receiving the object, say:	The third person describes the exchange:
δός μοι τὸ βιβλίον	δέχομαι τὸ βιβλίον.	ό/ἡ (name) τὸ βιβλίον σοι παϱέχει.

2. Now try the plural. In groups of four or five, two people ask for something, and a third describes the exchange. Now it's possible to collect even more stuff!

Example:	After receiving the object, say:	A third person describes the exchange:
δότε ἡμῖν τὁ βιβλίον/τὰ	δεχόμεθα τὰ βιβλία.	ό/ἡ (name) τὰ βιβλία ὑμῖν
βιβλία.		παφέχουσιν.

3. Who's in charge? The verbs ήγέομαι, πείθομαι, βοηθέω take the dative case instead of the accusative. Now describe Who leads whom? Who obeys whom? Who helps whom? Here are a list of nouns that you can use to describe likely possibilities:

Examples:

τὶς ἡγεῖται τοῖς ἑταίϱοις; ὁ Θησεὺς ἡγεῖται τοῖς ἑταίϱοις εἰς τὸν λαβύϱινθον. τὶς τῷ Ξανθία βοηθεῖ; ὁ Δικαιόπολις τῷ Ξανθία βοηθεῖ ἐν τῷ ἀγοῷ.
